Galatians 5:22 says...

"...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness and faithfulness." I was always told a fruitcake can last quite some time before going bad, but I was astonished to find out a Michigan family has kept one around for 141 years! According to the article I read, the keys to a long shelf life for a fruitcake are the ingredients and the preparation. Makes sense... It all starts with a great foundation. While that might work for a fruitcake, what are keys to an active faith in Christ that bears fruit? I would say it comes down to this: dependence upon Jesus. Like fruitcakes, I believe the word "dependent" has gotten a bad rap. Our American Experiment is founded on independence. People take pride in being fiercely independent and it all started with Adam and Eve. "Did God really say...?", the serpent asked. And, we're off and running... doing things our way. Trust, and complete dependence on God was broken. How do we request a do-over? One simple word: dependence. Romans 11:18-19 "But if some of the branches were broken off, and you, although a wild olive shoot, were grafted in among the others and now share in the nourishing root of the olive tree, do not be arrogant toward the branches. If you are, remember it is not you who support the root, but the root that supports you." The root, Jesus, supports us wild olive shoots, not the other way around. Yes, God did really say... Yes, though our independent nature struggles against it, it's in surrendering our will to God (daily, maybe by the minute) and fully depending upon Him that we bear fruit that lasts... much longer than a fruitcake!

What is scrip and how does it work?

- You purchase a gift card.
- That business gives back.
- The amount given back can be put towards a family's tuition or hot lunch account. It can also go directly to the school, into the Teacher Salary Fund, Tuition Assistance Program, or Hot Lunch Assistance Program.

There are over 750 gift card options available through scrip for places you already shop at (including grocery stores, gas stations, restaurants, stores...) We have local scrip. Right here in Lakefield you can buy gift certificates for Maynard's, Cutting Image, SoJo, Styles on Main, Village Green, or Horse Barn and Hunt Club. Amy normally has Maynard's, Cutting Image, and SoJo gift cards on hand (no wait!).

There are 3 easy ways to order scrip:

- Fill out the blue order form and turn it in by 8:00 on Monday morning. Order forms can be found in the church office or on the welcome center in the narthex. Your order will be ready to be picked up the following Monday.

When that happens, Pastor McDonald has the students write down questions they may have for him to answer. The questions do not have to be about what was studied for the day. Here are some examples of them:

What year was the flood? How old was John the Baptist when he died? How long was John the Baptist in the wilderness?

Great questions! I actually figured the first one out a 20 years ago. This is tricky because you can't just add up the years each person lived together to come up with the number. The sons lived while the parents lived. We also have to note that we have no Biblical information about how long Adam and Eve lived before the fall into sin or how long the heavens and the earth existed before the first day. Science tells us that the earth is billions of years old, but that can't be trusted. Adam was a functioning adult at his creation, whatever age that may be. He didn't grow up through being a baby, then a child, then a teenager, then an adult. He was an adult at his creation. So too, the earth was whatever age it needed to be to maintain life and allow it to thrive. Time really is kept from the fall into sin, when death entered the picture and our lifetimes were more defined. Here is the chart I made in 2003:

Enoch didn't die but was taken by God into heaven, so his years can't be added to the total since they are still ongoing. Lamech died before his father, so his years aren't added as well. From what I can figure from what the Bible says, the flood happened 1759 years after the fall.

We know from Luke's gospel that John the Baptist is 6 months older than Jesus. Jesus started His ministry when He was 30 years old (Luke 3:23). Matthew 3:1 tells us that John came preaching in the wilderness "in those days." Luke 3:2 tells us that John started preaching in the wilderness when Annas and Caiaphas were high priests. The Bible doesn't really tell us what year that was, but other historical documents do. Annas was made high priest by Quirinius from 6-15 AD. Caiaphas was high priest from 18-36 AD. Jesus started His ministry in 30 AD. Church tradition holds that John had a ministry that lasted a year and a half. So he would have been 31 or 32 when he died. Jesus' ministry lasted 3 years, which means He died when He was 33, and since John was younger, this fits the timing of the Bible.

As to how long John the Baptist lived in the wilderness, this is all conjecture. It is believed that he was a member of a group of Levites known as the Essenes, known for their asceticism, which means avoiding self-indulgent temptations like fancy food or nice clothes. Remember that John wore a leather belt (simple, not fancy) and ate wild locusts and honey (not fancy). The Essenes are thought to have hidden the Dead Sea Scrolls to protect them from the Roman soldiers. Again, Matthew 3:1 says John came in the wilderness preaching "in those days." So the answer it around the time Jesus came to be baptized, but we can't really get into specifically how long he was in the wilderness from the Scriptures. We know it was before Jesus was baptized, but we don't know how long before.
