





FROM TIME-TO-TIME confirmation class ends early. When that happens, Pastor McDonald has the students write down questions they may have for him to answer. The questions do not have to be about what was studied for the day. Here are some examples of them:

- Who is the oldest person in the Bible? Most would say Methuselah, who died at 969 years old. However, his father, Enoch, never died, so he is still walking with God in heaven still having birthdays. (Genesis 5:19-27; Hebrews 11:5)
- What was it like becoming a pastor? There is great joy in becoming a pastor, but there is a lot of trepidation with that joy. It is wonderful to tell people about Jesus and all God has done to save us. It is wonderful to tell people about how God created the world and how much He loves us. When going to the seminary to become a pastor, there are a lot of times when it gets tough. As a pastor, there are great joys and great disappointments to live through. When you love the people God has sent you to serve, but some of them do not want to listen or believe it is very sad. But when you see people growing in the faith, it makes pastors very happy.
