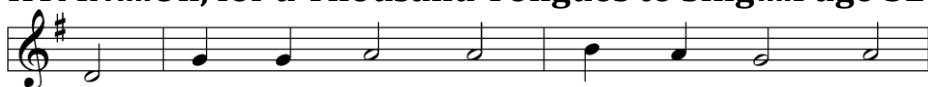

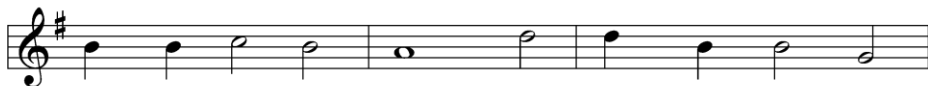
It Makes Us Want to Sing!

Traditionally, the Fourth Sunday in Lent is known as *Laetare Sunday*, from the Latin *Laetare Jerusalem*: “Rejoice with Jerusalem, and be glad for her” (*Is 66:10*), and though still in the penitential season, today is a relaxation from the norm. Flowers may appear, and ministers may wear rose colored vestments (as a lighter shade of violet). Therefore our service today is inspired by the First Song of Isaiah: “Sing praises to the Lord, for He has done gloriously; let this be made known in all the earth. Shout, and sing for joy, O inhabitant of Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel” (*Is 12:-6*). Today, in the joy of the faithful father in Jesus’ parable of the prodigal son, the forgiveness of our sin and reconciliation with God as His baptized sons and daughters, makes us wish to sing!

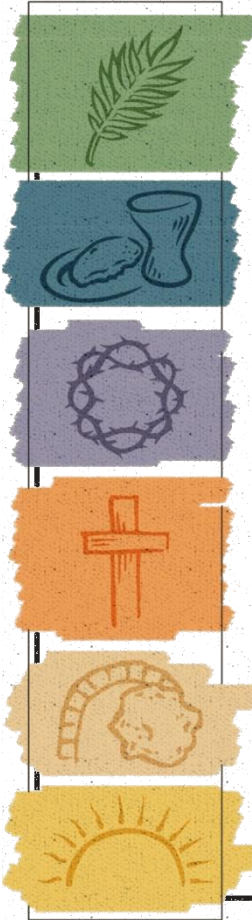
